included free health check-up, personalised Yoga advise, diet counselling, CBG checks and BP monitoring. Around 267 people were benefited from the camp.

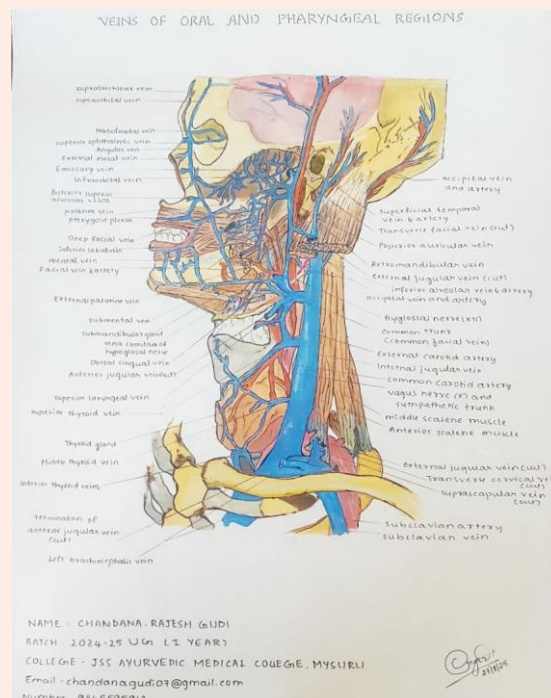


DRAWING COMPETITION FOR 1ST B.A.M.S STUDENTS
